### **FOREWORD**

The Marist Rosalie Old Boys' Association will hold its **2022 Annual General Meeting (AGM)** at the **Paddington Tavern** on **Saturday 19<sup>th</sup>. November 2022.** 

We have sent an "expression of interest" to all registered members asking that you indicate your intention to attend one or both events. We require this information so the Paddo can allocate sufficient staff to assist with managing our event. We have now received a number if RSVPS but many are still to come in.

For members who previously attended our AGM the process will be similar to 2020. Please arrive early for coffee, registration and be seated on time. The AGM will **commence at 11.00 am sharp.** We believe the 2020 AGM was a very successful day. We had approximately sixty members attend plus some special guests.

We are hoping for a much larger turnout in 2022 than we had in previous years.

The formal procedures for the **AGM** will be **followed by lunch.** There will be a bar open at the rear of the function room and food can be ordered from the menu. Paddington Tavern staff will come around to take your order on a table-by-table basis. Payment for drinks and food will be on individual basis.

This year has been a very busy year for the Old Boys and we have held a number of events. The first of these was on the 13<sup>th</sup>. April. This was The Marist Rosalie Old Boys' Association Annual Reunion.

The re-union was held at Souths Rugby League Club. Torrential rain poured down throughout the day and by evening it was a deluge. We experienced a large number of cancellations due to widespread flooding in Brisbane and this played havoc with road access. Regardless of these hazards, it was a very successful evening with a smaller yet inclusive crowd in attendance. The **Rosalie Tribute** match which was due to played the following day was postponed because of the severe deterioration of grounds and overnight weather.

The Marist Annual Sports Day was held on the 30<sup>th</sup>. April. Invitations were extended to Marist Rosalie, Marist Ashgrove and St. Laurence's 1<sup>st</sup>. XV players who had represented their schools in 1952, 1962, 1972 and 1982. The members of these teams were celebrated at a lunch in the Cyprian Pavilion. Following the luncheon, the former warriors from the three schools were introduced to the spectators on the main oval and presented with a medallion to mark the day.

The Ashgrove boys played St. Laurence's in the main game. The visitors were far too good and ran out winners in a hard-fought game.

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The Rosalie Tribute match which had been postponed from the 14<sup>th</sup>. April was rescheduled to 4<sup>th</sup>. June. It was arranged that Ashgrove would play against St. Edmund's College. Originally, Ashgrove was programmed to play Villanova.

It was a fantastic sight to watch the Marist Ashgrove team take to the field wearing the mighty Cerisee and Blue Colours. This was the first time these colours had been worn in a Premiership game in the seven years since the inception of the Rosalie Tribute Match.

Unfortunately, the boys in the Cerise and Blue succumbed to the visitors and the game resulted in a win to St. Edmunds. On the day Ashgrove had a number of injuries including absence of their entire regular front row. Regardless, St. Edmund's thoroughly deserved their win and were the better team.

Our most recent event was the Marist Vintage Lunch held on 13<sup>th</sup>. August and there were thirty-two Rosalie acceptances for the event. Two of the guys who had accepted had to cancel on the day, one because of Covid and the other for family reasons.

Invitations to the Marist Vintage Lunch are extended annually to Old Boys of Ashgrove and Rosalie who completed their education more than forty years ago. On the day, approximately one hundred and twenty old boys from both Colleges gathered in the Cyprian Pavilion. Rosalie was well represented and while we strive to achieve higher attendance numbers from our school, we celebrate those who were joined us.

The recognition we receive from these joint events by our long-time adversary Ashgrove; are very welcoming. These events are extremely enjoyable and it is a great opportunity to reconnect with former school mates.

Over the past five years we have gratefully received help from Marist College Ashgrove in many ways. They have provided assistance with locating lost Old Boys, technical help with website development and maintenance, collaboration in joint events such as the Marist Vintage lunch which has been renamed from the Blue and Gold lunch to The Marist Vintage Lunch. The Marist Sports Day lunch also recognises both Ashgrove and Rosalie jointly.

As we approach the final months of 2022, our Association continues to redefine its strategy. We have worked diligently to ensure the history of Marist College is enduring. Despite not having an operational college; we strive for recognition, particularly from Brisbane Catholic Education (BCE).

We are fully aware that our beloved school will never reopen in Paddington, but in 2020 at our end of year lunch we were encouraged by the previous Executive Director of BCE, Pam Betts, with the following words.

"Brisbane Catholic Education enjoys a wonderful relationship with Marist Schools Australia (MSA) and already work closely with Mark Elliot, Regional Director, and the team to bring the charism of St. Marcellin Champagnat to life in many of our school communities."

Pam emphasised in her speech that BCE wanted to "continue their close partnership with The Rosalie Old Boys; and would work with Frank Molloy at the national level and Mark in the Archdiocese of Brisbane. Therefore, as we plan for the development of future schools, we will again partner with MSA for one of those schools to be enriched by the charisma of St. Marcellin. At that school we will capture the spirit of Marist College Rosalie so that story of that great College will be preserved into the future.

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How this will look – we don't know, but we will engage with Jim and the Old Boys to explore the possibilities. "

Unfortunately, Pam retired from BCE at the conclusion of 2021 and her replacement, Dr. Sally Towns has been in demand since her appointment. Our first meeting with Dr. Towns is scheduled towards the end of September and we are hoping for an open and frank discussion regarding future opportunities for collaboration between Marist College Rosalie and Brisbane Catholic Education.

Clearly, our fortitude and resilience has remained unchanged since the school opened in 1929 and our Old Boy membership has never been stronger.

With the support of Marist Ashgrove and their resources we have an active website; we distribute a quarterly newsletter and have done so since 2018, we have built a membership base of almost 1,500 and we have built alliances and relationships with Ashgrove and Marist Schools Australia to enable us to reach our end goal.

Whilst Rosalie old boys are spread far and wide across the globe, they have never forgotten their roots.

Our school has produced some fine men, including clergy, politicians, members of the military, public servants, businessmen, entrepreneurs and those who have represented out beloved country in many fields and in many different ways.

More importantly, we have produced men who are proud Australians and decent, hardworking, family men.

We will continue to work hard for our old school and our loyal members.

We are currently redefining our strategy and how we will ensure the Spirit of Rosa lives on. This may require a deviation from our past but it is important the memories of Rosalie are not lost.

Our future may lie in a very different direction to our past history. We will keep you informed of plans for 2023 in the coming months.

In redefining our strategy, it needs to have a sense of purpose.

To ensure the memory of Marist Rosalie lives on and has a worthwhile direction we may need to set new goals and objectives.

The success of and future of the Marist Rosalie Old Boys' Association can only be achieved by the strength and resilience of a strong **active** membership.

We need former Old Boys to work with us to achieve these goals and objectives.

The final stanza of the poem "*Ulysses" by Alfred Lord Tennyson* gives me encouragement to keep moving forward.

We are not now that strength which in old days
Moved earth and heaven, that which we are, we are;
One equal temper of heroic hearts,
Made weak by time and fate, but strong in will
To strive, to seek, to find, and not to yield.

- If there is insufficient room for your motions, please provide them on additional pages.
- You may include an explanatory note about the motion which will be sent out with the meeting's agenda. It should not exceed 300 words.

Any motions or resolutions must be delivered or emailed to the Secretary **NO LATER THAN 5<sup>th</sup>. NOVEMBER 202**2.

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### **Election of Officers**

Twenty years ago, when Timor-Leste finally gained its hard-fought independence, the Australian Marist Brothers asked the Church in Timor-Leste how it might make a contribution to the country. The Bishop of Bacau invited the Brothers to set up a teacher training college, and so ICFP Teacher Training College was started. Using the teaching curriculum from the Australian Catholic University, this college has become one of the strongest beacons of hope for quality education in the small country. Graduates return to their communities not only with excellent academic qualifications but also with a Marist love for and commitment to the young people they serve. Trainee teachers come from across the country and AMS is seeking more sponsors to ensure that there are no barriers to every child receiving a top-quality education from a well-trained and committed teacher.

### **Australian Marist Solidarity**

Australian Marist Solidarity (AMS) envisions a world where young people have hope and the opportunity to access education. AMS believes that education is the best catalyst for positive change and partners with communities in the Asia-Pacific region to facilitate access to education for young people in need. AMS' vision is a world where young people have hope and the opportunity to access education.

AMS is an international development agency founded by the Marist Brothers Province of Australia and is a vehicle for expressing the solidarity of Marist Schools and the broader Marist community in Australia with our neighbours. AMS works through partnership with local communities in 18 countries across Asia and the Pacific to help young people reach their brightest potential.

#### **About the Role**

The Finance Officer role is responsible for administering AMS' financial systems and ensuring accurate recording, tracking and reporting of AMS' financial operations, including processing of accounts payable, recording donations, issuing receipts, making payments, reconciling bank accounts and preparation of month-end and year-end accounts. The role is responsible for ensuring sound internal controls are maintained and providing effective financial reporting to AMS stakeholders.

This is a hands-on role and would suit someone who enjoys working proactively and systematically, with high attention to detail and strong communication skills.

The position reports to the AMS Business Manager, but will also provide support to other members of the team, including CEO, Projects Coordinator, Fundraising Manager and Communications Manager, as well as reporting to the AMS Board's Finance, Audit and Risk Sub Committee.

Prior to commencing with AMS, you will be required to undertake a National Criminal History Check and hold or be willing to obtain a Working with Children Check (Blue Card). Please also be advised that COVID-19 vaccination is compulsory at Marist Centre Brisbane, which sits on the site of a school.

The successful candidate may be required to occasionally travel domestically.

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
