FOREWORD

We are now halfway through another calendar year and we have already held two events for our Rosalie Old Boys, The Tribute Match and The Marist Sport's Lunch. We still have three important events before 2023 comes to an end.

The next event, **The Marist Vintage lunch will be held at Ashgrove on 18th. August**, which is the Friday of Exhibition week. I am certain you will thoroughly enjoy the reunion.

Preceding lunch we will hold the annual AGM and it is your choice if you wish to attend. At the AGM all Office positions are declared vacant and the Committee for 2024 will be elected. Should you wish to nominate, you will need to complete the necessary documentation by the prescribed date which will be emailed to you.

We do not want to build a huge bank balance, but we do want to reward those members who support the Old Boys' Association.

Our committee continues to work tirelessly to ensure the history and memory of Rosa lives on. We do this by having strong membership and promoting the Rosalie brand through the events we hold. **We need your support and attendance at these events** to ensure these occasions are a success. Your commitment, communication and enthusiasm are important. The **total membership of the Rosalie Old Boys' Association has now passed the 1,400-member mark.**

It is vital that you, our members, support the Old Boys' Association so that the Catholic and wider Communities see that Rosalie is still functioning through our "Old Boys" Association.

When we held the Rosalie Leaders forum this year, we invited representatives from each year to come and tell us what we were doing right and in what areas we could improve.

What we heard was that it was important that The Rosalie Old Boys' Association needs to be more than just a social club and not just hold social events. We need to have a real sense of purpose. It is true to say that we had already recognised this. It became more obvious that we needed to escalate this as one of our major goals for 2023 and beyond.

We had previously donated a small amount of funds to Australian Marist Solidarity (AMS) to provide opportunity for young people to have the same education as we were given by the Marist Brothers. This amount was subsequently matched by other Old Boys. You can see the progress of our fund raising on our website.

We have formalised an alliance with AMS to support their cause in the Star of the Sea Province which encompasses the Pacific rim and beyond.

Because our Old Boys had embraced our decision to support this cause, we set up a link on our website to make it simple to donate to AMS. Our target was set at the modest amount of \$5,000 and to date the grand total of donations is \$1,253.

We were surprised that because of the positive feedback from many Old Boys, we thought the total gifting we would receive would be higher, especially with 1,400 members on our database. Less than \$1 per person is not overgenerous. We do ask that you find it in your hearts to consider a donation and reach into your pockets to donate to the Rosalie Old Boys' cause.





MARIST ROSALIE OLD BOYS ASSOCIATION

Many Rosalie Old Boys attended the Sacred Heart Convent before going to complete their education at our famous College and have strong and happy memories at this establishment.

We sincerely thank the Nuns and the Convent for their support going as far back to when the college opened in 1929. We encourage our members to attend this event to ensure it is an enormous success.

MARIST BROTHERS - 1928

Alongside the creation of the Sacred Hearts Girls School, Dean Lee had recognised the necessity for a boys' school and the pending arrival of the Marist Brothers would help address that need.

On 29 July 1928, on the western side of Fernberg Road, the Foundation Stone of the new Marist Brothers Monastery was laid by Archbishop Cattaneo, Apostolic Delegate to Australia, in the presence of Dean Lee and visiting dignitaries. Brother Osmond Rice was named as Director with his Assistants, Brother Althanasius Raess and Brother Campion. The new Marist Brothers Monastery was opened and blessed by bishop Duhig Sunday 20 January 1929. It opened for class on 28 January with 135 students enrolled. One year later the primary side opened with 220 students and the first secondary class began with six scholarship boys.



The first staff: Brother Osmond, Director, Dean Lee, P.P., Brother Athanasius and Brother Campion. Brother Osmond has been Director of St. Joseph's College Hunters Hill and Darlinghurst. His academic qualifications were M.A., B.Sc., Dip. Ed.

The first month was a trying one. The thermometer stood at 100-110 degrees. There were no blackboards, no protections on the veranda from inclement weather, no musical instruments. The desks were old and rickety, and the walls bare, in front of the house, stones and debris. Principal Brother Osmond, Diary

Since their arrival, the Brothers had taught in the original 1898 church building, which had been relocated to its Fernberg Rd position. When an unsound stump fell out from under the school, Father McCarthy and Archbishop Duhig decided that it was finally time for a new school building to house the Brothers and the boys.

During all their time in Rosalie, the Brothers have had to struggle against adverse conditions in the matter of buildings and equipment, and it was only when the old wooden church, which was the main portion of the school, threatened to collapse with disastrous results, that we were able to get a permit to raise this fine, well-equipped building. On 6 June 1948 the Foundation stone of the new Brother's school was laid. Distinguished guests included the Queensland Premier, The Hon EM Hanlon MLA, Minister for Works, The Hon W Power MLA, and Mr Earmon De Valera, Premier of Ireland, who performed the laying of the stone.

On Sunday 2 October 1949, Archbishop Duhig presided over the opening, blessing and dedication to the Sacred Heart of the Brother's new Sacred Heart College.

MARIST ROSALIE OLD BOYS ASSOCIATION

This magnificent school, built and equipped at a cost of less than P35,000, is a concrete act of faith in Christian education. In 1969 the Monastery and School were taken over by the Catholic Education Department.

The news was received with disbelief and heavy hearts that the Marist College had been separated from the Rosalie Parish. We had to face the truth that we were not financially in a position to provide the facilities and teachers to keep the College and maintain it in line with the general high standard that Marist Colleges enjoy. Nothing could sever the high regard in which the Brothers are held by the Parish, and the gratitude and affection we all feel towards them. **Author - Ellen Ries**
