FOREWORD

As we head into the last few months of 2023 there are only two more events to be held before we wind up another successful year for The Marist Brothers Old Boys' Association. Those are the AGM and the end of Year Reunion.

At the beginning of October, we will be sending out nomination forms and other documentation for the 2023 AGM which is scheduled for Saturday 25th. November. This again will be held at the Paddington Hotel in the Sync Room. The Paddo is the spiritual drinking hole for Rosa Old Boys especially for those that lived in the surrounding suburbs of the school.

The AGM is that time of the year when we review our efforts and elect officers for the coming year. If you believe you can contribute to our Association, please put up your hand. If you do not want to be a Committee member you can still help us on various projects. As Br. Cyprian Dowd once said. "You can never have too much help".

At this year's AGM we will be announcing the introduction of a charge for annual membership of the Old Boys Association. While we do not want to build a huge bank balance for the association, we do have expenses which need to be paid. We cannot do that without the support of our members. Our annual expenses include maintaining the website, software charges, newsletter production, government charges, postage, stationery, and several other costs.

Following the AGM, we will be holding our "End of Year Reunion Lunch". Some of you will remember the lunches that were held a few years ago at The Gap Tavern. We would like a good attendance for this event. If you would like an individual table(s) for your year, we are happy to organise this. It may be of particular interest to classes from 1953, 1963, 1973, 1983, 1993 and 2003 who are having major milestones this year.

Attendees will be able to choose from one of three food items from the menu. Guests will also be provided a free drink and some raffle tickets. The bar will also be open for ordering of drinks of your choice. We will be having some light entertainment on the day. I am certain you will thoroughly enjoy the reunion.

It has been another busy year for your committee. The regular events held included The Rosalie Tribute game and for the 13th. year the Ashgrove 1st. XV wore the cerise and blue colours onto the field.

In 2024 it will be necessary to replace the Rosa Jerseys the boys have worn for the last three years in the The Rosalie Tribute Game. We will be reviewing the design the boys will be wearing next year. The boys outgrow the jerseys and then there is the normal wear and tear factor.



We will be inviting members to make submissions and/or suggestions for the design of the replacement jerseys. Because of the long lead time to have the jerseys manufactured we need to start raising funds to pay for them very soon.

We were also involved with the Marist Sports Day event where Ashgrove hosted available members from the 1953, 1963, 1973 and 1983 1st. XV Rugby Teams from both Colleges. The representatives from both Colleges enjoyed a lunch together and were introduced to the crowd and then were presented with a memorial medallion of the event.

Another event we held in 2023 was the Leader's forum in the Rosalie Room at the Marist Centre. We had several College Captains and Vice-Captains in attendance. Some Captains or Vice-Captains were unavailable because of their residential location, although we did have a representative from most years. Those in the room provided us with valuable feedback on the day. Over 90% of the attendees who came indicated they would attend a follow up event in the future.

We asked the people in the room to tell us what we were doing right and in what areas we could improve. What we heard was that it was important that The Rosalie Old Boys' Association needs to be more than just a social club and not just hold social events. We need to have a real sense of purpose. It became obvious that we needed to escalate this as one of our major goals for 2023 and beyond.

Since that meeting, we have formalised an alliance with Australian Marist Solidarity (AMS) to support them in the Star of the Sea Province which encompasses the Pacific rim and beyond. Our goal for the remainder of 2023 was to raise money through donations for AMS. AMS work tirelessly in regions such as Timor Leste to provide education facilities to those less fortunate than our country.

We had previously made a small donation to AMS to provide opportunity for young people to have the same education as we were given by the Marist Brothers. This amount was subsequently matched by other Old Boys. You can see the progress of our fund raising on our website. We set ourselves a target of \$5,000 for 2023. We have fallen short of that amount with only \$1,495 being the total amount raised so far this year. We thought the total gifting to AMS would be higher, especially with 1,400 members on our database. The average of approximately \$1 per member is not overgenerous. We ask that you find it in your hearts to consider a donation and reach into your pockets to donate to the Rosalie Old Boys' cause.

We are grateful to those loyal members who not only gave a donation by putting their hands in their pockets but all those who give their time at meetings and events throughout the year.

The most recent event held for 2023 was the Marist Vintage lunch where twenty members from our Association attended.



At that lunch was the most senior old boy in age from both Colleges, Richard Rosenstengel, who attended Rosa from 1935 to 1938. Also in attendance was Br. Adrian Story who left the College after scholarship (Year 8) and completed his education at Mittagong before being professed as a Marist Brother

Another project we completed in 2023 was migration of our members database to a new software application (HubSpot). We thank both Chris Byrnes and Chris Speare for the time and effort they have both given us to make this project successful. Firstly, Chris Speare for converting the data from our existing system and designing the necessary fields in the new system.

Chris Byrnes arranged for the software application available free of charge for our use and provided training. Chris Byrnes also uploaded into HubSpot the data Chris Speare had downloaded. HubSpot is a very sophisticated CRM system and is simple to use and is suitable for any businesses, large or small.

HubSpot will allow us to better communicate with our members. We can quickly produce a mailing list of any class members or group that we have on file. It allows us to assist members or class groups who might be holding reunions or get together with their fellow mates. This year we have already provided information to several classes.

We continue to call on "Old Boys" to come forward to assist in various roles to help continue to ensure that **The Spirit of Rosa Lives On**. The success of The Rosalie Old Boys' Association is due to the support we receive from our members, and it is true to say we need to get more help to continue our journey.

Our committee continues to work tirelessly to ensure the success of our Association. We do this by having strong membership and promoting the Rosalie brand through the events we hold. **We need your support and attendance at these events** to ensure these occasions are a success. Your commitment, communication and enthusiasm are important.

One of the main benefits of having strong members support is that the Catholic and wider Communities see that Rosalie is still functioning through our "Old Boys" Association.

Our college will celebrate the centenary of its foundation in 2029 and our aim is to plan something special for that event. We already have suggestions including a book, or a publication to honour the event. In the coming year we will be talking to members regarding contributing through personal effort for a publication and/or a financial donation. With your help this project can be a huge success.

If you would like to be a member of the sub-committee, we will be forming to make our centenary a special occasion please let me know as soon as possible.





HUBSPOT CRM AND KLYP

When The Marist Rosalie Old Boys' Committee made the decision to hold the "Leader's Forum" in 2023, we knew that for us to give continuous improvement in the services we provide to our members, our communication tools needed to be upgraded to a platform more suitable for our association. We

PETER KENNY, AUTHOR – CLASS OF 1967, TOLKIEN FAN

Peter Kenny is a retired schoolteacher based in Brisbane. Peter possesses one of the most significant personal collections of Tolkien memorabilia in Australia and the world. Peter has a passion for everything Tolkien and in four decades has become a recognised authority in the field sharing his knowledge and passion for Tolkien's stories with adults and children around the world through a series of presentations at schools, libraries, conventions and festivals.

During his forty years as a teacher, he often used The Hobbit as a literacy unit in the classroom and shared Tolkien's world with hundreds of students through

reading stories and composing art.

Now retired, Peter writes poems songs and fantasy stories inspired by Tolkien's Middle earth as a hobby and shares his work in his presentations and with his friends.

Described as Australia's biggest Tolkien fan, Peter Kenny has over 1000 pieces of memorabilia relating to the fantasy author's tales – *The Hobbit* and *The Lord of the Rings*. "It's certainly the most diverse in the country," he says.
